Tom McDevitt is the chairman of the board of directors of the *Washington Times*, a newspaper in Washington DC, United States.^{[1][2][3]} He is a member of the Unification Church (which indirectly owns the *Times*) and in the early 1980s was the pastor of the church in Washington DC.^{[4][5]} McDevitt's wife of 20 years, Soon Ja, died in 2002. They have five children.^[6]
