Christopher Edwards (born 1954) is an American author. He wrote *Crazy for God: The Nightmare of Cult Life*^[1] a memoir of his 7½-month experience as a member of the Unification Church of the United States in 1976. In an interview while promoting his book, he said he travelled with a bodyguard and was afraid for his life.^{[2][3]}
